#### **IMPROVED SERVICES**

DDAS is delivered by 3 organisations within a consortium. These agencies are led by Drugaid and include Kaleidoscope and G4S. All these agencies have extensive expertise and specialist knowledge and have come together to deliver evidence based and pioneering services across Carmarthenshire, Pembrokeshire and Ceredigion'.

DDAS (in partnership with Choices young person's services) has a large black bus from which we offer harm reduction services and outreach campaigns. The bus allows DDAS to cover the region and take our services to users. Ask a DDAS or Choices worker for the bus timetable or stick out your thumb as we drive past!

DDAS is funded by the Dyfed Area Planning Board – this is a multi-agency partnership comprised of representatives from Carmarthenshire, Pembrokeshire and Ceredigion County Councils, Hywel Dda Health Board, Dyfed Powys Police and the Police and Crime Commissioners Office, and the National Probation Service.

# **FAMILY & CARER SUPPORT**

The families and loved ones of people who use substances can need as much support as the users themselves. This can include direct family, carers, neighbours, friends, support staff and anyone else in the network around the person affected. We offer comprehensive treatment packages to families, friends and carers that include:

- PACT (Parent and Carers Training)
- Structured support
- Telephone advice & support
- Peer group support
- Mutual Aid

Where practical DDAS encourages concerned others to be part of the support package for the substance user.

# TRAINING AND PROFESSIONAL ADVICE

DDAS offers training and support to health and social care staff and a range of other professional agencies working with substance users. This includes:

- basic substance use training
- brief interventions for substance users
- advice, information and guidance on specific substances
- ongoing consultancy and support

# PARTNERSHIP WORKING

DDAS works with its partners to ensure that users' needs are met. With the user's consent to share information DDAS staff will refer to specialist local agencies to address more complex issues. These include Community Drug and Alcohol Teams for clinical support and social care.
