SPIKE ON A BIKE

Spike on a Bike is a service offered by Dyfed Drug and Alcohol Service (DDAS) where you can get clean injecting equipment and other harm reduction services delivered straight to your door – fast and for free. It is the first of its kind in the UK and second in the world, along with a similar initiative in Vancouver (Canada).



SWANSEA

Swansea has joined Cwm Taf and Gwent (within our operational areas) in setting up and facilitating a Peer to Peer Naloxone service.

Peers, who have formed Swansea Against Fatal Episodes (S.A.F.E), were joined by representatives from the Western Bay APB and South Wales Police on 3rd & 4th March.

Since the training, the peers have distributed over 70 kits and have played a part in two overdose incidents, which saved two lives.

Upcoming campaign


Choices West are due to launch their 'Sesh Den' campaign. This will be piloted in Pembrokeshire and rolled out into other counties, once complete. The 'Sesh Den' will recreate scenarios that young people may encounter whilst out and using substances, such as overheating from MDMA.

Overdose Prevention Service van visits Llanelli

In partnership with Transform Drug Policy Foundation, the Glasgow Overdose Prevention Service (OPS) van, set up by Peter Krykant in 2020, as a peer-led response to reducing drug related deaths and rising HIV infections among people who inject drugs, visited Dyfed-Powys Police Headquarters and Llanelli town centre, last month. Dyfed-Powys Police and Crime Commissioner, Dafydd Llywelyn said:

"The visit here at Headquarters today allowed us the opportunity to have a look at a unique harm reduction intervention example and to talk to experts regarding overdose prevention services."

We were sad to learn that a harm reduction powerhouse, Sara McGrail, sadly passed away last month. Sara was well known across the UK for her advocacy for people who use drugs and services who support them.

Sara spoke eloquently at our 2014 conference and was part of our 'A Failed War' film in 2015. But is most well known by many for her key note speech at HIT's 2012 Hot Topics conference in Liverpool, where she rightly criticised the UK government's inadequate approach to reducing the harms associated to drugs:

"If harm reduction is out of fashion, then to hell with fashion! Harm Reduction is as relevant, and possibly more important, than it has ever been before."

A potential life saving app for people who use drugs

People who are using drugs alone can download the **Buddy Up** app and be connected to a Cranstoun volunteer, with whom they can build a rescue plan in the event of an emergency. If the person overdoses, it will send an emergency message to them, triggering the appropriate medical attention. This app, available to anyone within the UK, is all about preventing avoidable, fatal overdose.


