



### CONFERENCE 31st May 2023

We are delighted to see the return of our annual national conference. This years theme is 'Stigma, Oppression & Exclusion: Transforming the Narrative' and hope it will be the most dynamic and thought provoking yet.

### THE REAL IMPACT

Just before Christmas, a young person engaging with Gwent N-Gage, disclosed how the impact of the costs of living crisis has led to her going without food all day, on several occasions and gone to bed crying with frustration and hungry.

N-gage worked with the school to come up with a list of basic goods/food for her and her sister (who she lives with) and a list of gifts that would be suitable for Christmas. A shout out to local services and businesses resulted in donations including bags of store cupboard food and luxury items for Christmas, 2 large hampers including food and jewellery, a second-hand laptop, toiletries, chocolates and gifts, straighteners and hair products and a £40 voucher for Tesco. An electric clothes drier was also donated as the young person had reported not being able to afford to put the heating on to dry her clothes for school.

The items were taken to the young person and her sister on the 22nd December. She said that she was overwhelmed by the kindness shown to her by these services and she felt she could enjoy Christmas 'like normal people do' without worrying about feeling cold and hungry. She said that she felt 'spoilt' for the first time in her life.



With many young people and families reporting more challenges with increasing cost of living, the team have started a food/items bank that will be kept in the Newport office. Any donations are greatly welcomed.

### Swansea CHOICES

Choices Swansea have continued supporting their youth panel in addressing challenges with Stigma, mental health and exclusion, following the 'what matters conversation'. Their engagement and views have been raised for discussions with the Western Bay Safeguarding Board and as part of the Participation and Children's Rights team within Swansea Local Authority.



The Swansea Choices team enjoyed their team building activity, bowling this year. We identified some very competitive individuals amongst the team!

The Info-Nation drop in opened its doors following two years of being closed as a drop-in, due to Covid19. Multiple services from across Swansea attended and young people received free prizes upon entry and plenty of food!

The Overdose Prevention Service van once again visited Wales on 26th January. This time, in partnership with <u>Transform</u>, the van visited Merthyr Tydfil and highlighted how such harm reduction services can have multiple, significant benefits to people who use drugs, their families and the local community.









Following this, over 70 people attended an Anyone's Child Event in Aberdare, where bereaved loved one's shared incredibly impactful stories of those they have lost to substance use and how current policies failed them. We also heard from Neil Wood, an ex-undercover policeman and Barod's own Rob Barker.

## Social Media

As ever, Barod continues to be active on social media on a daily basis, marking relevant awareness days along the way, in line with our EDI objectives.

We have been promoting our Live Webchat Service, which is open 7-days a week.





Following recent media attention around people who use drugs, we have run a mini #EndToStigma campaign.


